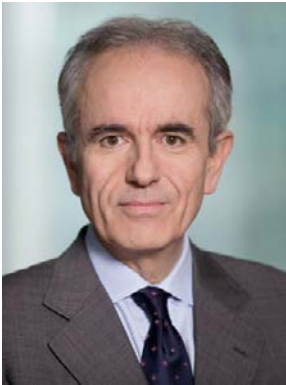


IGNAZIO ANGELONI, European Central Bank



Member of Supervisory Board at European Central Bank, where he serves as a representative of the ECB. He covered the role of Director General of Macro-Prudential Policy & Financial Stability at European Central Bank. He served as Deputy Director General of Research of the ECB since 1998 and its Directorate General of Financial Stability. From 1994 to 1998, he taught Monetary Economics at Luiss University in Rome. From 1986 to 1998 he worked with the Bank of Italy and spent his last three years there as Head of the Monetary and Financial Sector of the Studies Department. He serves as a Member of the Supervisory Board of MTS S.p.A. He served as Chairman of SACE S.p.A. He served as Director of EIB.

GABRIELE GIUDICE, European Commission



Head of Unit “EMU deepening and macroeconomy of the euro area” at DG ECFIN of the European Commission. After graduating in 1992 at Bocconi University in Milan, he has been spending his whole career within the European institution: as an economist (1994-2004) at DG ECFIN; as a member of Private Office of Commissioner Almunia (Economic and Monetary Affairs, 2004-2008); as a Head of Unit “Business Surveys” at DG ECFIN (2008-2009), “UK, Sweden, Estonia, Latvia, Lithuania” (2009-2012) and “Greece” at DG ECFIN (2012-2016).

ANDREA MONTANINO, Atlantic Council



Director of the Global Business and Economics Program at the Atlantic Council. He leads the Council’s work on global trade, growth, and finance. He formerly acted as executive director of the International Monetary Fund (IMF), representing the governments of Italy, Albania, Greece, Malta, Portugal and San Marino. Before joining the IMF, he was a career officer in the Italian Ministry of Finance from 2006 to 2012. He also spent four years (2001-2005) at the European Commission in the Directorate General for Economic and Financial Affairs.

LORENZO FORNI, Prometeia



Professor of Economic Policy at the University of Padua and General Secretary of Prometeia Associazione. He worked at IMF in Washington from 2010 to 2016, at Fiscal Affairs Department and, previously, for the Bank of Italy. He dealt with various macroeconomic areas, i.e. the role of fiscal policy, the impact of public and private debt on the economic system and the implications of the membership of the EMU. He published various reports on international specialized magazines like *The American Economic Review* and the *Journal of Public Economics*. PhD in Economics at the Boston University in 2001, he was a visiting scholar at the University of Harvard in 2005-2006.

GIUSEPPE LUSIGNANI, Deputy Chairman Prometeia



Professor of Economics of Financial Intermediaries at the University of Bologna, he is an independent director on the board of several companies.
